A message from your LSIA President

Fall greetings to you all!

While our fall newsletter and membership meeting have normally been an October event, we will blame the glorious fall weather for our slight delay into November - a month in which we give thanks to our many blessings. As it relates to Lake Sarah this year, we have many accomplishments we can all be thankful for, of which the "top ten" is worth highlighting:

- 1. Our long awaited TMDL study was approved by the EPA in April a testament to the years of hard work from Huck Burrows, Mike Peterson, and others that contributed.
- 2. Scott Walsh and his "outlet army" who limited our all lake no-wake zone to just 2 weeks whereas many other area lakes were restricted for 2 months or more.
- 3. Our TMDL Implementation plan was written by Richard Brasch and approved by the MPCA in September.
- 4. Our membership grew by 33% this year to an all-time record of 179 members under the leadership of Sonja Tilbury thank you all for your support!
- 5. Fred Lang, Cindy Keating, and Brad Spencer who have completed daily water level readings that now extends to 13 years worth of meaningful measurements.
- 7. A Clean Water Legacy Grant was filed by the cities of Medina and Loretto which if successful will provide treatment for approximately 490 acres of our watershed on Loretto Creek.
- 6. Two Clean Water grants were filed by the City of Independence under the leadership of Brad Spencer to target projects that will reduce phosphorus from reaching Lake Sarah.
- 8. We received another \$500 gift from RBC to honor Brad Spencer's years of volunteering his time and talents to the Lake Sarah community most notably by his lakesarah.com website
- 9. Another 1,000 walleyes were stocked this fall thanks to Joe Slavec and your walleye fund donations. Several 16" walleyes were caught this summer attesting to the success of the program.
- 10. We have \$41,161 in funds readily available under the watchful eye of Roger Van Beusekom to help towards projects planned to begin in 2012.

It is an honor and a privilege for me - and for all of us - to have such dedicated volunteers that are making a clear difference in protecting, preserving, and improving the natural and aquatic environment of Lake Sarah. In support of their efforts, let's thank them all by renewing our LSIA memberships now for 2012 - and please consider becoming a volunteer this coming year so that we can continue to build on the momentum from 2011.

Water Level and Outlet Update

A total of 161.5 man hours was spent clearing out Sarah Creek from 150' lakeside to County Road 92!

An estimated 10,000-20,000 lbs of loose material was removed from the creek. The work started in March and ended in August.

A big thanks goes out to all the

volunteers who helped with the work and all who signed up!

As of today there is a small beaver dam at the weir. Three Rivers Park District has issued a permit for a trapper. While the outlet area has a sign posted indicating the presence of traps, please be sure to take extra caution to keep your pets

away from this area!

Once the trapping is complete we will clean out the small dam and walk the creek to make sure we have no obstructions for spring snowmelt.

LSIA is working with Three Rivers Park District, The Pioneer Sarah Creek Watershed and City of Greenfield to come up with an on going maintenance plan for the creek. Lets hope we get some moisture soon!

Walleye are in!

Once again Lake Sarah was stocked with 1000 walleye fingerlings! The fingerlings were purchased from Rademacher Ponds and were released into the lake on November 3rd.

We have been setting them in three areas of the lake and it seems to be working well. The walleye that have been caught (and released) are from all corners of the lake so we know they are spreading out and finding food and habitat.

We are still hoping to put some

pressure on the DNR to help our cause. If anyone is interested in making a phone call occasionally to let the DNR, please let me know. You can email me at joe@mplsgarage.com. I can provide you with a phone # and a brief statement you may want to use when making the call.

It's free - won't take much of your time, and would be much appreciated in our quest to help get the DNR to match our financial investment into the walleye supply.

As winter approaches, please

remember to leave the lake as you found it! Last year, there was one particular fish house that left 6 piles of nails and ash on the lake that were a pain in the rear to clean up. Please be respectful when ice fishing this winter! Thanks!

West Metro COLA in Partnership with MN Waters. The challenge minnesot of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) in Minnesota Lakes has grown, most recently with the discovery of zebra mussels in Lake Minnetonka. As a result, lake associations in the metro area have been working to find ways to prevent zebra mussels from spreading to other local lakes.

Terrie Christian, a member of the Association of Medicine Lake Citizens (AMLAC) began organizing a meeting with the Three Rivers Park District to discuss AIS prevention strategies, and the interest in this meeting quickly spread to other local lake associations in the area that share the same concerns. Soon the idea of a regional Coalition of Lake Associations (COLA) was formed along with

Minnesota Waters is a state wide nonprofit organization with extensive experience in working with concerned citizens to organize and take action on lake and river issues.

The main goal of the West Metro COLA will be to create an AIS action plan for the west metro lakes area. Working as a coalition with other local lake associations will give us a stronger, more unified voice with the DNR - much moreso than what we can accomplish on our own. Sonja Tilbury attended the first COLA meeting on behalf of the LSIA, and we are pleased to advise that Terrie Christian will be our guest speaker at our Fall Membership meeting on Thursday, Nov 17th, where she will further explain the West Metro COLA - and what we together hope to accomplish. In unity there is strength! We hope you will attend.
