

## **Treasurer's Report**

The Treasurer's Report shows a balance of \$17,733 through May 31, 2013, which is down from the beginning of the year balance of \$45,688. We have paid \$46,710 relating to the CLP treatment through May while having receivables from the DNR of \$26,000 and Three Rivers Park District / Pioneer Sarah Creek Watershed of \$9,923. Once these are collected, we will have a balance similar to 2012.

PUBLIC RELATIONS – Coordinate activities: meetings, boat parade, picnic, etc.


FUND RAISING - Promote fund raising activities and grants

## **Water Level Report**

The most recent water level reading was 980.41' on June 23, 2013. Over 5.5" of rain fell Friday morning 6/21 through Sunday morning 6/23, which pushed water levels to new highs for 2013. For reference, our 100 year flood elevation is 981.20' and our no-wake trigger level is 981.10' (for 3 consecutive days). The Ordinary High Water Level for Sarah is 979.90'. Thank you to Cindy Keating (west bay) and Fred Lang (east bay) who continue to volunteer their time to monitor our lakes' water levels for the MN DNR, LSIA, and LakeSarah.com for yet another year!





### Summer Fish Kills

A number of metro lakes are experiencing fish kills right now, and it appears Lake Sarah has some fish dying off too. This is not related to Lake Sarah's CLP treatment, but rather it is due to the fast warming water and some decomposition of weeds. This is a normal occurrence for all lakes and happens every summer.


## **Water Quality Update**

We're pleased to share that on May 15th we treated 260 acres of Lake Sarah for Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) and we have since confirmed via 3 lake wide post treatment inspections that we have effectively killed off all CLP in the entire lake - well before the CLP had a chance to form their "turion" seeds. While this is a great 1st year accomplishment, we want to remind everyone that the sediment survey last fall confirmed an average of 1,100 turion seeds in each square meter of sediment - which explains why this will be at least a 5 year journey to gain full control of CLP.

Our total cost for the CLP treatment was \$48,165 and with the DNR grant of \$26,000, and the "cost sharing" by the TRPD and Watershed of \$9,923, we were left with \$12,242 of costs to cover by your donations. We are pleased to report that we had 87% of shoreline owners contribute - and some donated more than the suggested \$100. In total, we received \$15,295 in contributions designated specifically for this CLP treatment - which exceeded our total costs by \$3,053. Please note that as we are on a 5 year plan for treating CLP, the availability of DNR grant funding can vary greatly from year to year. The LSIA board agreed to preserve these excess donations to apply only toward future CLP treatments - where the DNR grant funding might not be available.

As for Eurasion Water Milfoil (EWM), the other invasive species we are wanting to control, we have yet to see enough EWM to warrant treating.

We believe it may still "pop" - as it can grow as much as 3 inches per day - and thus we will continue to monitor the EWM growth, and we will submit for a DNR permit to treat up to 50 acres of EWM - should it become a problem. To date we have seen less than 30 acres of EWM, and where it is located it does not appear to be causing much of a nuisance problem. We will keep you updated as we continue to monitor EWM.



Our weed inspections are confirming we have mostly Coontail, a native species which we want to see replace CLP and EWM as it provides the cover and oxygen the fishery needs - with limited surface matting. In some places the Coontail is quite thick, in which case we suggest you consider borrowing the LSIA owned Beach Buddys as a roll-in rake option to remove your nuisance Coontail. The Beach Buddy rake is ideal for sandy and gradual sloped shorelines - with limited rock riprap. If you have a nuisance weed problem, feel free to call Joe Baker at (612) 868-8702 to discuss potential further options in more detail.
